



01 Eyes for the World

The following document is a rough copy of Pastor Drost's sermon notes

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+ This morning's reading is from **Acts 1 verses 1-12**

¹In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ²until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." ⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." ¹²Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. Acts 1:1-12 (NRSV) **This is God's Word**

+ **Prayer**

+ Last May I got my motorbike licence. I used to have a licence 40 years ago but I had let it go. So, I had to take a four-day motorbike course. I'm very glad I did! I learned a lot of great advice on how to drive safer. One thing they drilled into me was to look ahead, don't look down in front of your front tire, or at your gauges, look 12 seconds ahead (The 12 sec rule)...

- This will give your eyes time to see what's ahead and respond properly to what's coming.
- **When you are looking at the ground right in front of you, everything is moving very fast and you tense up**, your body goes into stress and panic mode. But when you look **AT WHERE YOU'RE GOING** (110 Km/h = ¼ mile), things slow down giving you a better perspective and more time to respond.

LOOK AT WHERE YOU'RE GOING and the bike will go where you are looking. So, **if you are TURNING**, don't look down, look at where you are going. Turn your head and look at where you want to go and the bike will follow your eyes.

Similarly, Jesus spends 40 days teaching his apostles how to ride their "spiritual bikes" ... giving them the basics of the road ahead!

- They're all focused on looking at the gauges:
"...is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?"
- They're all consumed with the "front tire" ...
"What's happening now?" "What about us?"

Jesus gives them the "12 second rule" ... **stop looking at your front tire, look ahead, eyes on Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the world. EYES ON THE WORLD!**

Those were his last instructions and then he ascended to heaven. And no sooner he did, they got their eyes on the wrong place again... looking up!

So, Jesus had to send two of His instructors to tell them again...

“Why are you looking at the sky? **12 second rule! EYES ON THE WORLD! Head for Jerusalem!**”

✚ Last week Mark Miller quoted a prayer that World Vision’s founder, **Bob Pierce** prayed: **“Let my heart be broken with the things that break the heart of God.”**

What concerns God? What is He looking at?

Where are His EYES focused? What breaks His heart?

In my notes I have recorded 114 Verses in the Bible that talk about God’s concern for the needy, the poor, the homeless, the foreigners, the orphans and the widows? **Verses like:**

"Defend the cause of the weak and fatherless; maintain the rights of the poor and oppressed. Rescue the weak and needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked." Psalm 82:3-4

"The LORD WATCHES (His eyes are on them) over the foreigner and sustains the fatherless and the widow." Psalm 146:9a

"Whoever oppresses the poor shows contempt for their Maker, but whoever is kind to the needy honours God." Proverbs 14:31

"Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and He will reward them for what they have done." Proverbs 19:17

"If you spend yourselves on behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then your light will rise in the darkness, and your night will become like the noonday." Isaiah 58:10

Then the passage we have been looking at this week as a church: **The Matthew 25 Challenge**. When King Jesus goes to judge the nations of the world, His measuring stick will be:

Did you feed the hungry? Did you give water to the thirsty?

How did you treat the foreigner? Did you take them in? Help them?

Did you clothe those who needed clothing? Did you visit the sick?

How did you treat the prisoner? Did you go to them?

“The King will say to those on His right hand, ‘Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.’ Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?’ And the King will answer and say to them, ‘Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.’” Matthew 25:31-40 (NKJV)

GOD'S EYES ARE ON THE WORLD!

- 10 years ago when we got involved as Freddylink focusing on Haiti, we LIFTED OUR EYES TO THE WORLD and started to live out Matthew 25. We have been able to provide clean water, food, clothing, hope, love for hundreds of **“the least of these my brethren”**
- As Jesus approached Jerusalem here is what it says...

“As Jesus drew near (Jerusalem), he saw the city and wept over it.” Luke 19:41

As He looked at Jerusalem, He had compassion on them. Because they were in need, lost!

As we lift up our eyes, from our busy lives, and do the 12-second rule and see Fredericton, may we feel compassion and a desire to care for our city as well!

I hear story after story of people in our church LIFTING THEIR EYES TO THE WORLD (looking outside of our church walls) getting involved in helping with the Soup Kitchen, the Shelter, SUN, SUN-Lite, Housing First... providing food, clothing, furniture, shelter, a place to call home, hope, love for **“the least of these my brethren”**

I'll never get tired of quoting this verse...

For God so loved the WORLD (Eyes on the World) that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. John 3:16 (NKJV)

God loves the WORLD!

After Jesus rose from the dead, He told His disciples:

Jesus said to them, “Go into all the WORLD (Eyes on the World) and preach the **GOSPEL (Good news) to all of creation.” Mark 16:15**

 It was a little over a year ago that I went to Haiti. Our team met local nurses on home visits, a prenatal and postnatal clinic, visited schools, classrooms, local management committees, clean water stations that we had helped build that gave clean water to hundreds of families, met with families that wanted to tell us how the program had helped their children, prayed and worshiped with them in their church. (These are **“the least of these His brothers!” MY brothers and sisters in Christ!**)...

I had the opportunity of looking into the faces of hundreds of beautiful children and to know that we had a huge part in making a difference in their lives.

I met three of my sponsors children and their parents... Christella... Wikenley.... and Nethseida...

I was so proud and thankful to God for our church and for FreddyLink. In about 8 years we have sponsored over 500 kids and their families. That represents thousands of people (brothers, parents, neighbours) that are benefiting from our efforts! In dollars it represents over 1.5 million dollars.

And I came home with a passion to do more!

Guys, **we can make a huge difference when we lift our EYES and SEE THE WORLD.**

That world that God loves!

But you know what happens? I know because it happens to me! We get looking at the day to day stuff, looking down at the gauges, at our busy schedules, and **we lose sight of the WORLD**; of the things that really matter to God!

When I get looking down I can lose sight of the thousands of kids like Christella... Wikenley... and Nethseida... **I can get too busy to care about the needy, the poor, the homeless, the foreigners, the orphans and the widows...** about the **GOSPEL** and the fact that PEOPLE MATTER TO GOD and they need to matter to me!

All I want us to do today is to stop and remember the “12-second rule” and lift our eyes and look at the world...

- If you have a sponsor child, pray for them
- If not, consider taking one on today...
- Pray for our city (The needs of our city)
- Pray for the world (OPEN OUR EYES LORD!)
